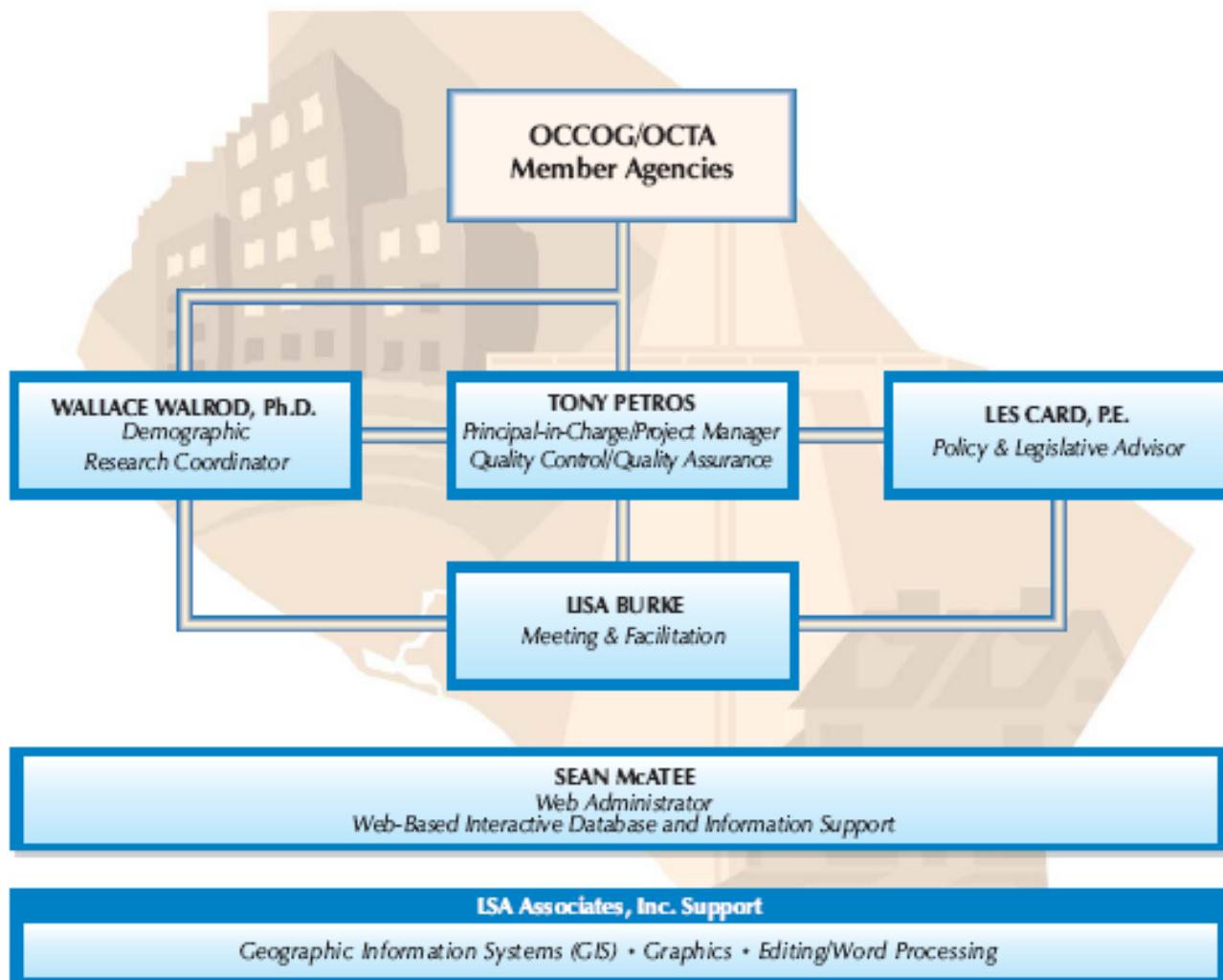

- Draft & Final OC SCS
 - Integrate input from OCCOG/OCTA meetings, community/stakeholder workshops, web tool
 - Track and document all comments
 - Iterative and collaborative process
