1. Welcome

Committee Member Comments:

A committee member asked if the public are getting this project confused with TCA's 241 extension. Josue said there has been a large effort to educate the public that this is not a continuation of TCA's project.

A member asked if all the ramps were going to be improved. Josue said the ramps that were shorter required the full ramp to be improved.

Another committee member asked if the bike and pedestrian improvements were contingent on the HOV lane extensions. Josue said yes. The committee member followed up asking about the main goal of the project. Josue responded the goal is to improve connectivity within the county and surrounding areas.

Public Comments

A member of the public said the bike lane coming down Marguerite comes to a sudden stop and cyclists must merge across two lanes to continue straight. He recommended they add green striping to extend the bike lane so the drivers are aware.

A committee member asked what separation would look like between vehicles and cyclists. Niall said cyclists would have their own striped lane but no concrete barriers.

A committee member asked if the e-bike information will be sent to all the cities and Kristopher said yes.

A committee member asked if any materials were being created to teach vehicles how to drive safely around cyclists. Kristopher said they have in the past and it is on their website.

A committee member said it would be good to create materials to encourage tourists to use active transportation when they visit Orange County, especially those renting e-bikes.
