A. I-605/Katella Ave Interchange Active Transportation Update Chris Boucly provided a presentation on this item. <The full presentation is available on OCTA.net.>

Committee Member Comments

A committee member asked if there is any consideration to slow down traffic at the Katella intersection near Los Alamitos High School because people come off the freeway very fast. Chris Boucly said he would take this information back to the team.

A committee member asked if the green paint on the road is a standard. Chris said it is only the second place in Orange County to be implemented that he is aware of. The committee member said they think it is a very beneficial tool.

A committee member asked if there will be any additional signage and Chris responded yes, it is being addressed and it is an element of improving safety.

B. I-5 (SR-73 to El Toro Road) Stage 2 Bridge Extension Fernando Chavarria provided a presentation on this item. <The full presentation is available on OCTA.net.>

A committee member asked how the Navy base is moving along on their project with the bike facility on the northern side of the bridge. Peter Sotherland said their project was further south so he is not sure what is going on in their project but he will look into it. The committee member expressed the importance of this area because of the gap it causes in the loop and Peter said yes, this is a high priority part of the project.

A committee member said it is nice to see the network of routes forming across the county and asked about the availability of funding for these types of projects. Peter said there has been an increase over the past several cycles in Active Transportation Program (ATP) funding and there are a lot of grant programs popping up. He said Denise will provide more details about funding in her presentation.
