BACKGROUND

The Orange train station, also known as the Orange Santa Fe Depot, has served as a passenger rail hub since the late 1800s. The station building, built in 1938, is recognized as one of Orange's historic landmarks. Approximately 750 Metrolink passengers board from the Orange Station each weekday. From Orange, Orange County's Metrolink service offers local residents an alternative way to get to work, school or fun destinations in Los Angeles, parts of north and south Orange County, Riverside and San Diego.
