Board Approves Draft Plan Aimed at Improving Bus Service

The Orange County Transportation Authority's board of directors approved a draft of the Making Better Connections study that is reimagining OC Bus service to better connect Orange County residents, workers and visitors to the places they need to be.

The draft service plan includes increasing bus service on high ridership routes, reducing wait times and simplifying the structure of bus routes. The draft plan is the result of the initial phase of public input and extensive staff analysis.

OCTA is now seeking more public input over the coming weeks with several community meetings and outreach at community events, along with an online and onboard questionnaire.

After public and stakeholder input is addressed, a final service plan will be brought to the board for consideration in the fall. Once approved by the OCTA board, the improvements will be implemented as early as February.

Board Recognizes May Employees of the Month

Minor Service Changes Coming to OC Bus June 12

The OCTA board received an update on minor OC Bus service changes that will take effect on June 12.

OCTA implements schedule and route revisions to select OC Bus routes several times a year. In March 2020, an emergency service change was implemented to balance a sharp decline in ridership due to the state's stay-at-home order to help reduce the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19). Since that time, OCTA has made numerous adjustments to bus service to support ridership growth, improve service and align with changes in traffic conditions.

The changes planned for June 12 will improve service on 20 OC Bus routes. These include schedule adjustments to bus routes that are typically impacted by summer beach traffic and school closures.

The next opportunity to make adjustments to OC Bus service will occur in October. In addition, future service changes will be informed by the Making Better Connections Study, which is identifying potential improvements to OC Bus service.
