# About the Program

## **Section 5316 – Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC)**

Federal funding for projects intended to meet needs, gaps, and barriers to transportation services.

- Funds employment-related programs and services
- Serves persons of low income
- Provides operating and capital funds



# Current Grant Programs

10 participating agencies

- \$8.1 million in Section 5316 (JARC) and Section 5317 (New Freedom) funding
- Funded through September 2013

\$6.4 million in remaining JARC funds

- Competitive call for projects
- OCTA eligible to compete for funding

# Process

## Call for Projects

- Notices to 200+ agencies released June 13, 2011
- Application workshop on June 23, 2011
- Six applications received by July 25, 2011

## Evaluation

- Seven-member evaluation committee
- Five projects recommended for funding

## Award and Implementation

- Execute cooperative agreements
- Grant administration meeting
