Twenty-five years ago in 1995, the 91 Express Lanes made history by offering commuters an alternative for their daily trips between the Inland Empire and Orange County. Motorists soon discovered the timesaving advantages of non-stop travel on one of the world's first fully automated facilities with demand-based pricing.

Since 1995, much has changed. In 2003, OCTA purchased the privately held lanes for the public, removing restrictions and opening the way to improvements that benefit all motorists along the entire SR-91 Corridor.
