

28 Projects by 2028 Games 2.0 - LA Metro

Description:

 LA Metro has committed to completing 28 critical transportation infrastructure projects by 2028. These projects are designed to improve connectivity and reduce congestion during the Olympic Games.

- 18 are on schedule for completion by 2028
- Ten are facing challenges
 - Would require ~\$26.2 Billion+
- Currently seeking ~\$3.2 billion for quick-build capital and operational improvements
 - Replacing unachievable projects from original 28 by 28.

2028 Mobility Concept Plan

Description:

• This plan serves as the comprehensive transportation strategy for the 2028 Games, focusing on enhancing mobility for the Games and beyond.

- Planning for a "Transit-First" Games
 - Spectators primarily use public transportation.
 - Parking at venues will be limited to support essential operations
- Identifying priority projects beyond the original 28 by '28 initiative.
 - Games Route Network
 - Games Enhanced Transit System
- Metro Board update expected in early 2025.

Games Route Network

Description:

 Outlines specific corridors and transportation routes that will facilitate the movement of athletes, officials, and spectators between Olympic venues.

- Preliminary plans and traffic analysis completed.
 - Final design stage is expected in Winter 2024/25.
- Key measures include priority lanes, traffic signal improvements, and strict road-use enforcement.



Games Enhanced Transit System (GETS)

Description:

• Provides additional public transit capacity during the Games, focusing on areas with limited rail coverage.

- Requires around 3,000 buses to support spectators and the workforce during peak Games operations.
 - OCTA to provide 20+ buses
 - Coach operators and mechanics needed too
- Temporary park-and-ride locations, bus malls, and staging areas are being planned.
- Route planning is underway
 - 2026 World Cup will act as a smaller-scale test



Challenges

- Timeframes Game venues will not be final until late-2024
- Funding LA28 agreements with International Organizing Committee agreement do not include funding for spectator transportation and related costs
- Regulations Federal funding and regulatory support is key but complicated and not guaranteed
- Exceptions The Olympic bid assumed use of freeway and arterial network by the Games Family and requires coordination with Caltrans
- Resources Ability to borrow buses or train sets may have constraints
- Governance Need to improve interagency planning to ensure integration

OCTA's Role

- Support OCTA bus riders and Orange County's essential workers
- Offer transit access to any Olympic venues in Orange County
- Provide transit options to spectators visiting or staying in Orange County
- Support the LA Metro 2028 Games Mobility Concept Plan
- Coordinate with GME partners to offer seamless access to the games (subject to resources and funding availability)
- Enhance the image of transit and boost long-term OCTA transit patronage
