A. Project B: I-5 (I-405 to SR-55) Project Update

Committee Member Comments:

A committee member asked has there been any reduction in vehicle to bicycle interaction with the new striping that's been done at Culver. Niall Barrett responded he would have to get that information from the City of Irvine.

A committee member asked will the green striping be grandfathered in across more parts of the project. Niall Barrett said he is not sure there will be green striping and will check with the project manager, but the crosswalk would be signalized at the end of the on-ramp.

A committee member asked if cities and zip codes can be separated out of the analytics to see the increases from year to year. Kristopher Hewkin responded he would check and see how granular they can get.

A committee commented they saw many Bike Month ads in Anaheim and have seen an increase in riders at the Anaheim Convention Center.

C. Active Transportation Program Update

Committee Member Comments:

A committee member said I know in a couple past meetings the OC Loops and how they connected to different segments of the bikeways were discussed. The committee member asked does that Bikeways Connectivity Study, the money going into that program or is that ancillary to the OC Loops. Peter Sotherland responded that it is literally tangential in that we will be using the regional bikeway network of which the OC Loop is part of as the area of focus for where we will evaluate the Master Plan of Arterial Highways (MPAH) roadway segments so we can connect the segments to things like the OC Loop. He added we are going to be developing a Bicycle Propensity Index which would look at socioeconomic, geographic and land use factors to create a heat map which the OC Loop would be augmented by.

A committee member said our community hosts a variety of events which community members ride their bikes to. These events provide great opportunities to share bake safety education to all ages. Peter responded they will be looking for events like these to host bikes rodeos at.

A committee member said the Orange County Supervisors are looking at developing a bike ordinance that Director Foley brought up and the Board approved, and will you be involved with that? Peter responded yes; we have been providing feedback

A committee member said Safe Routes to School is an excellent program and has been providing a lot of e-bike safety awareness.

A committee member asked where the term high zero car household came from. Peter responded it is from the American Community Survey (ACS) census data.
