The Orange County Transportation Authority has begun construction of the Placentia Avenue and Kraemer Boulevard undercrossings. In accordance with federal railroad safety regulations, residents should expect to hear an increase in the frequency of train horns because of construction activities on and around the railroad tracks, regardless of quiet zone designation.

Regular work hours are Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The following construction activities are anticipated to begin during the next two weeks:

Placentia Avenue

- Continue installing shoring for bridge construction
- Install shoring for pump station
- Continue installing shoring for retaining wall construction (north of tracks)
- Remove abandoned/conflicting portion of waterline on Fender Ave.
- Continue excavating portions of Placentia Ave. and Fender Ave. north of BNSF shoofly for shoring activities

Kraemer Boulevard

- Continue installation of retaining wall 2 CIDH/Secant piles
- Continue placement of bridge temporary shoring tie-backs
- Continue and jack and bore sewer line under tracks
- Continue to form, reinforce and pour retaining wall 1
- Begin installation of 60" RCP storm drain at Kraemer Boulevard / Orangethorpe Avenue intersection
- Begin relocation of Anaheim waterline at Kraemer Boulevard / Orangethorpe Avenue intersection

Orangethorpe Avenue

- Preconstruction activities including demolition and utility relocations continue

Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive

- Preconstruction activities including demolition and utility relocations continue

Lakeview Avenue

- Right-of-way activities ongoing
