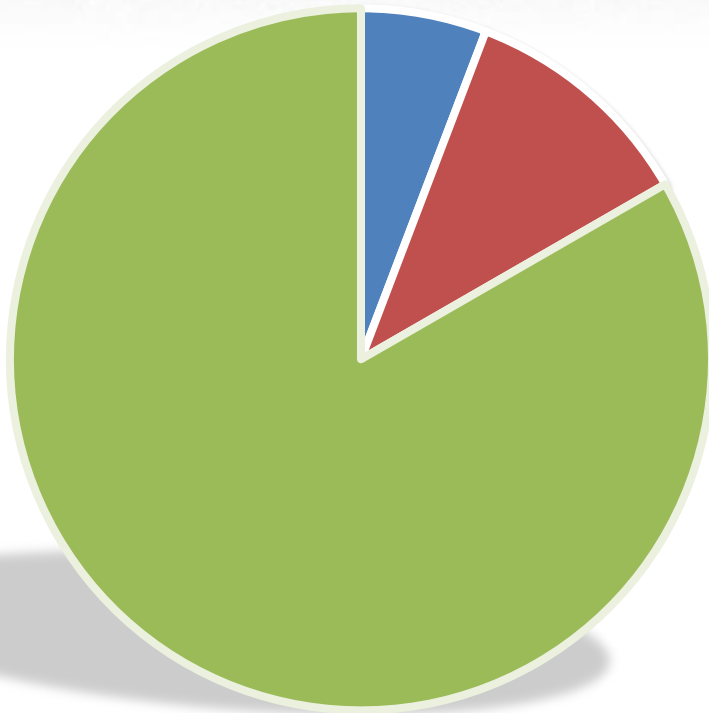

Project Improvements



- New 6 mile Westbound and Eastbound (EB) lane
- Add second EB exit lane
- Widen 3 bridges
- Reconstruct 15 ramps
- Signage, lighting, barriers
- 1 ½ mile soundwall
- Bioswale and landscaping
- Estimated completion late 2012

Cost and Funding



Planning/Environmental: \$4.3M

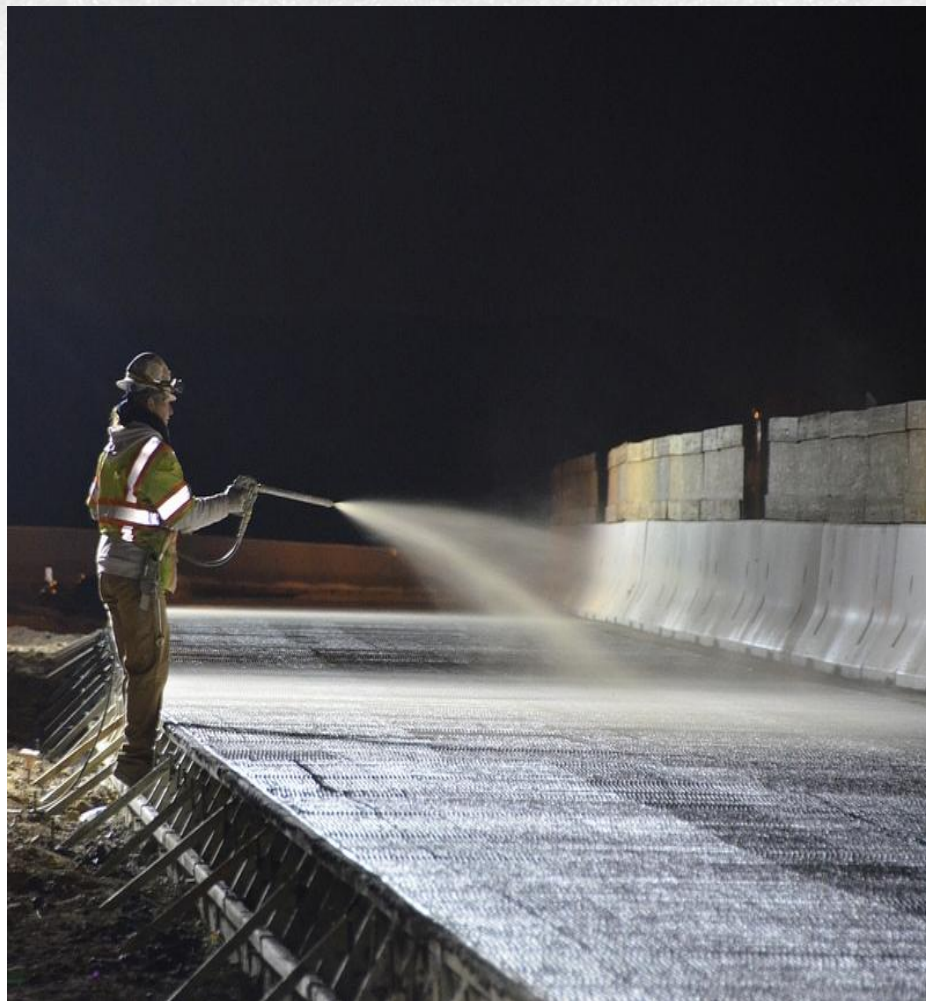
Engineering: \$8.1M

Lane Paving



- Paving 12 lane miles
- Standardized widths
- Portland Cement Concrete
- 25 – 30 year life span
- Concrete asphalt shoulders
- New striping throughout limits

- Reconstruction and realignment


