COASTAL RAIL EMERGENCY PROJECTS

OCTA and Metrolink to begin emergency work Monday April 28

The Orange County Transportation Authority, in coordination with Metrolink, is taking emergency action to stabilize the rail line in north San Clemente.

Construction Activities

What

Contractors will begin mobilizing equipment as they prepare to remove the remaining spans of the San Clemente Beach Trail bridge near Mariposa Point and place riprap at locations between North Beach and Mariposa Point. The trail will be closed intermittently. OCTA plans to restore the bridge and pedestrian trail as part of a future project that needs California Coastal Commission approval.

The current construction activities are expected to take approximately six weeks to complete. During this time, rail service will be suspended through San Clemente. For rail service details, visit: www.metrolinktrains.com/service-updates and <a href="https://www.metrolinktrains.com/servi

The construction work may be loud. The schedule is subject to change due to inclement weather or unforeseen operational issues. Train horns may be sounded.

When

Contractors are expected to begin work on Monday, April 28. Crews will work from 5 a.m. to 8 p.m. seven days a week. No nighttime work is anticipated.

Staging Areas

Contractors will be staging equipment and materials in the North Beach parking lot and on city-owned property off of El Camino Real.
