PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Anaheim Regional Transportation Intermodal Center (ARTIC) is a major multi-modal transportation hub serving commuters and residents in the City of Anaheim. ARTIC provides various transit connections in addition to OCTA buses and Metrolink trains, such as services from Pacific Surfliner Amtrak, Anaheim Resort Transit (ART), shuttle and charter bus service, taxis, bikes, and other private transportation services available.

Expanded to be a multi-modal station and accommodate future high-speed rail systems, the project relocated the prior rail station from leased land in the Los Angeles Angels parking lot to its new permanent location, ensuring ongoing train service in the area.

This project is part of the OC Go program. OC Go (also known as Measure M), is a 30-year half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements in Orange County through 2041. After experiencing the success and progress of Measure M1, nearly 70% of Orange County voters renewed the half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements to launch OC Go in 2011. In addition to OC Go funding, this project received funding from federal, state, and local sources.

- New passenger information display system that tracks departures and arrivals for buses and trains
