

About the Project

The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA), in coordination with Metrolink, is replacing the railroad bridge over San Juan Creek in the City of San Juan Capistrano to enhance safety and reduce maintenance needs. Once the new bridge is completed and train service is switched over, the existing bridge will be demolished. Construction is expected to be completed in early 2027.

San Juan Creek Trail Set to Close Nov. 12-22

The San Juan Creek Trail is expected to close as soon as Tuesday, Nov. 12 to Friday, Nov. 22, from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The trail will reopen at the end of each workday.

This closure will allow crews to construct a retaining wall and perform work on the new railroad bridge.

Trail users will be detoured to Camino Capistrano, Del Obispo Street and the Trabuco Creek Trail. Detour signs will be installed prior to the closure. Click on the map to enlarge.

This work may be loud. Schedule is subject to change due to inclement weather or unforeseen operational issues.



Retaining Wall Construction

Crews are continuing to construct a retaining wall next to City Hall and the Santa Margarita Water District facilities. This work is expected to continue through the end of the year. Construction vehicles are accessing the location using Paseo Adelanto.
