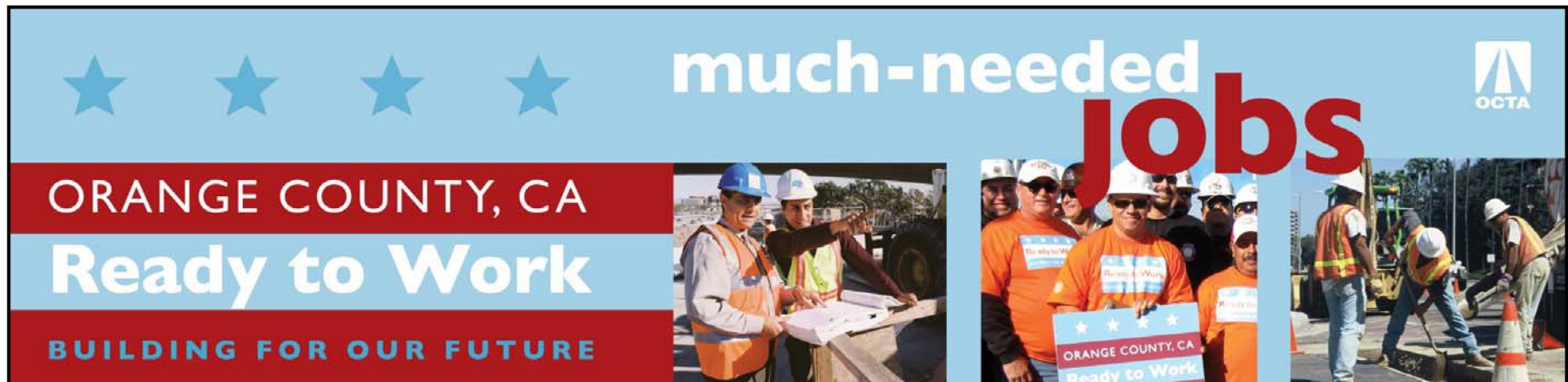

Economic Stimulus Plan

- \$212 Million
 - \$98 million for highways
 - \$77 million for transit
 - \$37 million for city specified projects



Economic Situation Affecting Bus Service

- Transit operations funding eliminated
- Sales tax down
- More than \$330 million shortfall



OCTA Action Plan

- Pay freeze for administrative employees
- Capital expenses cuts
- Hiring freeze
- Bus service cuts



SB 375

- Goal is to reduce greenhouse emissions
- Links land use, housing and transportation
- No guaranteed funding source



Freeway Improvements

- SR-91 lane addition
- SR-57 freeway widening
- I-405 improvement project
- I-5 interchange improvements
