
More than \$1.15 billion provided to local jurisdictions to date:




M2 Transit Program



- Metrolink service, station, track and grade crossing safety improvements
- OC Streetcar underway
- 23 community-based circulators
- \$130 million allocated to expand mobility choices for seniors and persons with disabilities
- 112 transit stop enhancements

Environmental Cleanup Program (ECP)

- Over \$60.2 million allocated for 226 water quality projects
 - √ 69.5 million gallons of trash captured


Freeway Environmental Mitigation Program (EMP)
