



YOUTH RIDE FREE

QUICK GUIDE FOR SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS



The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Youth Ride Free Program is available for the 2025-26 school year. A new pass is required along with a new parental request form. Using the new pass, Orange County youth ages 6 to 18 can ride OC Bus for free for travel to school, work or fun all year long.

In order to distribute this pass to as many youth as possible, OCTA is offering the Youth Ride Free pass in partnership with Orange County K-12 schools. Schools are asked to collect parental request forms and distribute the passes to students – this allows students to receive their free passes as quickly as possible.



Your Role as a Partner

We need your continued support and that of your school to help make this program a success and to provide the free pass to as many youth as possible. Your role includes handling parental request forms and distributing the passes to students. See below for details.

Identify a Point of Contact for Your School

Distribute Passes to Students; Collect and Store Parental Request Forms

Distribute, collect and store completed parental request forms and provide the Youth Ride Free passes to students.

PROGRAM GUIDE FOR SCHOOLS

OCTA is providing a quantity of Youth Ride Free passes and Parental Request Forms to schools. These new passes are valid for use and can be distributed immediately.

Previously issued Youth Ride Free Passes will continue to be accepted until September 30, 2025.

The initial quantity of passes provided to each school is based on overall school enrollment and pass usage from the school's students. Schools are welcome to request additional passes from OCTA if needed.



How Parents Request the Passes

Printed copies of an updated Parental Request Form are provided to schools with the new passes. Students who have previously submitted a form must submit an updated form. The Request Form is deliberately minimal to make requesting the Youth Ride Free pass easy for parents. The form indicates the consent of the parent / legal guardian for their child to be issued a Youth Ride Free pass and also provides information about the program.

The Parental Request Form has also been designed to minimize administrative efforts for schools. Space is provided on the form to note the serial number of passes issued to students.



Program Administration

Completed Parental Request Forms are to be returned to the designated point of contact(s) at a student's school.

Once the school receives a completed Parental Request Form, it provides the student with a Youth Ride Free pass. Please be sure to note the pass serial number on the completed form.

To minimize the amount of Personally Identifiable Information handled, and ensure the security and privacy of that information, OCTA will not collect the completed Parental Request Forms. OCTA asks that schools store the completed Parental Request Forms should there be a need to verify parental approval.



Year-End Document Disposal

At the end of the 2025-2026 school year, schools should promptly destroy any collected forms in accordance with their secure document disposal policies.
