April Employees of the Month Recognized

The Orange County Transportation Authority's Board of Directors recognized three employees of the month for April.

Passenger Rail Service to be Temporarily Halted through San Clemente to Allow for Emergency Reinforcement

The OCTA Board received an update on emergency efforts to protect the only coastal rail link between San Diego and Orange counties, which faces ongoing threats from bluff collapses, erosion, and storm surges.

Starting Monday, April 28, passenger rail service through San Clemente will be suspended for about six weeks to allow crews to safely stabilize the most at-risk sections of track. Construction work includes repairing and reinforcing coastal protection in three key areas, placing sand and constructing a catchment wall to prevent landslide debris from reaching the tracks.

During construction, Metrolink will continue to operate trains traveling southbound to as far as the Laguna Niguel/Mission Viejo station. For updates, on Metrolink service, visit metrolinktrains.com/service-updates.

Amtrak Pacific Surfliner will continue to operate modified service, with bus connections provided between Irvine and Oceanside. For schedule updates, visit pacificsurfliner.com/alerts.
