## PROJECT PURPOSE

To enhance traffic flow in San Juan Capistrano, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), in cooperation with the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA), is working to improve the southbound ramp interchange on Interstate 5 (I-5) at Camino Capistrano. Currently, vehicles at this interchange back up onto the freeway, causing excessive congestion. This project will widen the off-ramp and Camino Capistrano at the ramp intersection.

## PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- Add a merging lane to the southbound off-ramp
- Add a second southbound left turn exit lane
- Provide a yield-controlled, right-turn only lane to the southbound on-ramp
- Add travel lanes to Camino Capistrano
- Add a sidewalk on Camino Capistrano
- Add a bike lane on a portion of Camino Capistrano
- Replace and extend a soundwall along the off-ramp merging lane
